Dear Parent/Carers,

During SATs week, **Monday 11th May – Thursday 14th May**, we would like to invite all Year 6 pupils into school early, **from 8.30am**, to attend a Breakfast Club. We will provide a selection of toast and sausage sandwiches for the children to eat alongside fruit and yoghurt, whilst they spend time with their friends. All dietary requirements will be provided for. Previously, we have found Breakfast Club to be successful in allowing children time to relax before their assessments begin and in ensuring that all pupils arrive on time for the assessments without feeling rushed on their arrival.

All Year 6 children are invited to attend and, if possible, we would like all our Year 6 children to begin the day together - if your child usually attends Care Club, we can arrange for them to be brought up to school at 8.30am.

You will need to register your child on Arbor. This can be found under “Activities, Clubs” on the Arbor app. [A voluntary contribution of £5 towards the cost would be much appreciated, but is not essential. Please can we also stress the importance of 100% attendance throughout the week. Our whole Year 6 cohort cannot start their assessments until all pupils are in school and registered. Strict Department for Education (DfE) and Standards and Testing Agency (STA) rules dictate that, should a pupil be absent on the day of the test, we would have to isolate the pupil away from the rest of the Year 6 group until they have sat the missed assessment. This is to ensure the integrity of the test materials and to ensure no child is given an unfair advantage.

If you have any questions regarding Breakfast Club or SATs week, please speak with Miss Winkley, Miss Morris or Mr Lockwood. Please do continue to reiterate, as we are in school, that we are extremely proud of how hard everyone has worked so far this year and SATs week is just a formality.
